Many radar manufacturers are building their own transponders and receivers that seamlessly incorporate the Automatic Identification System, the dual-band technology that allows recreational boaters to receive transmissions alerting them to dangerous crossing situations with approaching commercial vessels. But for a user-friendly starter kit, try SeaCAS SafePassage, which can plug into a USB port on a computer with the supplied 33-foot cable. The computer powers the unit and receives AIS data via any number of navigation software programs. SeaCAS also can wire to an existing AIS-ready radar or plotter.

SeaCAS is capable of receiving ship data on channels AIS1 (161.975 MHz) and AIS2 (162.025 MHz) simultaneously from all commercial vessels within a radius of up to 30 nautical miles and can operate between the extreme temperatures of 5°F and 131°F.
